

## 6<sup>th</sup> sitting of the Sejm, 25–27 January 2012

**THE SEJM PASSED THE ACTS** amending the act which itself amended the act on the system of education and some related acts.

### THE SEJM ADOPTED RESOLUTIONS

- concerning the nomination of Magdalena Gaj for the position of the President of the Office of Electronic Communications;
- concerning changes within personal composition of the Sejm committees.

**THE SEJM CONSIDERED THE SENATE'S RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE ACT** amending the act on the finality of accounts settlement in payment and securities settlement systems and on the principles of supervision of those systems, the act on particular financial securities and the Bankruptcy and Remedial Law.

**THE SEJM RETURNED TO THE COMMITTEE** the draft Budget for 2012.

### THE SEJM REFERRED TO COMMITTEES

- Government bill on the tax on particular minerals extraction;
- Government bill on the effects of entrusting labour to foreign persons illegally residing in the territory of the Republic of Poland.

### THE SEJM ACCEPTED

- information of the Prime Minister on the situation within the Polish health care service as regards the new principles for medicine refund;

- Government report on the state of forests and the report on implementation of the National Forestation Programme in 2010.

**THE SEJM CONSIDERED** current information on fuel prices in Poland.

**THE SEJM REJECTED THE MOTION** for a vote of no confidence in the Minister of Health, Bartosz Arłukowicz.

Adam Żyliński took the Deputies' oath.



## 7<sup>th</sup> sitting of the Sejm, 27 January 2012

### THE SEJM PASSED THE ACTS

- the Budget Act for 2012;  
The Budget assumes 2.5% increase of the GDP, 4.6% increase of the export and 3.2% of the import, 2% increase of the domestic demand, as well as 1.5% increase of the investment expenditures.  
The planned inflation rate equals 2.8, and the maximum unemployment rate – 12.4%. An average gross salary in the domestic economy is to increase of about 4%, while the assumed indexation rate for retirement pay and social benefits equals 4.8%.
- amending the act on payments within direct aids system and some related acts.
