

**RESOLUTION**  
**of the Sejm of the Republic of Poland**  
**of 2 March 2007**  
**on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of signing the Treaties of Rome**

The Sejm of the Republic of Poland welcomes the 50th anniversary of signing the Treaties of Rome, recognising that European integration remains the best guarantee of peace, security and prosperity in Europe.

We, Poles, have been able to join this process only after the victory of the “Solidarity” movement and the overthrow of communism. It was only then that the Polish dream of taking part in the reunification of Europe could come true.

For the vast majority of Poles our membership in the European Union is an opportunity to fulfil our dreams of modernisation, technological progress, economic growth and a more efficient rule of law.
