

RESOLUTION
OF THE SEJM OF THE REPUBLIC OF POLAND

of 9 July 2025

on migration policy and protection of the eastern border of the Republic of Poland

The Sejm of the Republic of Poland expresses its support for the actions of the Government of the Republic of Poland aimed at comprehensively sealing the eastern border and developing new solutions in the field of migration policy that ensure the security of the state and its citizens, as well as respond to the challenges resulting from the migration pressure used as a tool of destabilisation by the regimes of the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus.

The Sejm of the Republic of Poland recalls that negotiations on the Pact on Migration and Asylum ended in the Council of the European Union in October 2023. At that time, the Council adopted a negotiating mandate for talks with the European Parliament. Work on the Pact took place under the Prime Ministers Beata Szydło and Mateusz Morawiecki. During this time, insufficient action was taken to safeguard the interests of the Republic of Poland, particularly in terms of addressing the unique situation of our country as a border member of the European Union, subject to externally inspired migration pressure. Neglecting these issues contributed to the adoption of solutions unfavourable from the point of view of Poland's security and stability.

The Sejm of the Republic of Poland notes with appreciation the consistent actions taken by the current Polish Government to restore effective control over the eastern border and build a common position among European Union member states against hybrid threats. These actions contribute to strengthening national security and building European solidarity based on real challenges.

The Sejm of the Republic of Poland expresses its objection to the current wording of the Pact on Migration and Asylum, as it fails to take into account the realities of border states and the risks resulting from politically inspired migration pressures. The Sejm of the Republic of Poland calls for action to amend the current arrangements and to take into account the interests of countries particularly vulnerable to such threats, such as Poland. These countries should receive genuine, systemic support from the European Union, both financial and political, proportional to the scale of the challenges they face.
