

RESOLUTION
OF THE SEJM OF THE REPUBLIC OF POLAND

of 25 July 2025

on the EU – Mercosur agreement

Polish and EU agriculture is based on the highest standards of quality and safety, and broadly defined food security is currently a guarantee of the independence of both Poland and the entire European Union from other countries and economic stakeholders.

Details of the provisions of the draft European Union – Mercosur agreement and the procedure for finalizing it raise concerns among politicians, consumers, and food producers. Current EU regulations do not guarantee the same standards for products manufactured in the European Union and those imported into its market. Polish consumers assume that food products sold within the European Union meet high EU standards in terms of production safety, agents used in production, animal welfare, and respect for the environment. The agreement drafted by the European Commission does not provide such guarantees. Polish producers cannot be forced to compete with producers who do not meet basic production quality standards.

The agreement assumes increased trade in goods such as meat, which contradicts the sustainable consumption promoted by the European Union. We emphasize that the development of other industries in the European Union cannot come at the expense of Polish and European agriculture.

The Sejm of the Republic of Poland opposes the European Commission's plans to abandon the procedure of ratification of this agreement by individual states in favour of its approval solely by the Council of the European Union and the European Parliament.

Taking the above into account, the Sejm of the Republic of Poland supports the Polish Government in its efforts to block the European Union – Mercosur agreement prepared by the European Commission in its current form.
