	 draft position of the Republic of Poland transmitted by the Council of Ministers <i>ex officio</i> by virtue of the Cooperation Act (within statutory deadline of 14 days of the receipt of EU draft), accompanied by: a substantiation including impact assessment, information on the type of EU law-making procedure and on the voting procedure in the Council, as well as information on the compliance of an EU draft legislative act with the subsidiarity principle, opinion of the Sejm's research bureau concerning substantive and legal issues, including compliance with the subsidiarity principle. 	

Proceedings in the EUAC 3 meetings (usually) Voting	 Having at its disposal government's information and the Sejm's research bureau opinion, as well as, in some instances, external opinions, the Committee makes a decision. If the Committee decides that a draft legislative act infringes principle of subsidiarity, it adopts opinion in this regard. At the next meeting EUAC adopts draft resolution of the Sejm on non-compliance of the EU draft legislative act with the subsidiarity principle (<i>right to initiative for a resolution</i>). The Committee resolutions require a majority vote in the presence of at least 1/3 of the total number of members of the Committee.
Proceedings in the Sejm 2 readings Voting	 Resolution containing reasoned opinion on subsidiarity, as all other Sejm's resolutions, is considered in two readings. The first reading is held at the meeting of EUAC which adopts a report on the draft resolution of the Sejm; the second reading (amendments can't be introduced) – at the plenary session of the Sejm which adopts a resolution. Adoption of the resolution containing reasoned opinion, like other resolutions, requires simple majority vote in the presence of at least half of the statutory number of Deputies.
Transmission of the reasoned opinion to EU institutions	 Resolution of the Sejm containing reasoned opinion on the non- compliance of the EU draft legislative act with the subsidiarity principle – after have been signed by the Sejm's Marshal (President) – is transmitted, with English translation, to Presidents of the European Parliament, the EU Council and the European Commission.
