

RESOLUTION
of the Sejm of the Republic of Poland
of 11 December 2003
on the Treaty establishing a Constitution for Europe

In view of the meeting of the Intergovernmental Conference of the European Union devoted to adopting the Constitutional Treaty, which commences in Brussels, the Sejm of the Republic of Poland reiterates the validity and effectiveness of its position described in the Sejm Resolution of 2 October 2003.

In particular, the Sejm of the Republic of Poland confirms that the system of weighted votes in the Council of the European Union, as stipulated by the Treaty of Nice of 11 December 2000, remains the best guarantee of implementing the principle of solidarity within the European Union. The Sejm of the Republic of Poland urges the Council of Ministers to effectively defend this system.

The Sejm also stresses that Poland's adoption of both the Constitutional Treaty as well as any future amendments thereto shall require the consent of the Republic of Poland granted by a representative of the Council of Ministers in the relevant European institutions and subsequent ratification procedure stipulated by law.
